The Shire of Esperance commissioned a MARKYT® Community Scorecard to:

- Support a review of the Strategic Community Plan and Corporate Business Plan
- Assess performance against Shire objectives and key performance indicators (KPIs)
- Determine community priorities
- Benchmark performance









### The Study

The Shire of Esperance commissioned CATALYSE® to conduct an independent MARKYT® Community Scorecard.

Scorecard invitations were sent to all households and post office boxes within the Shire of Esperance. The Shire of Esperance provided supporting promotions through its communication channels.


The scorecard was open from 15 March to 2 April 2021.

The scorecard was completed by **900 community members** with various connections to the Shire of Esperance, including:

- 865 local residents
- 157 local business owners or managers
- 152 community organisation managers/committee members
- 33 Elected Members and Shire employees

The main body of this report shows responses from local residents, excluding residents who are elected members or Shire employees. Local resident responses were weighted by age and gender to match the ABS Census population profile.

Where sub-totals add to ±1% of the parts, this is due to rounding errors to zero decimal places.



### MARKYT Industry Standards

CATALYSE® has conducted studies for close to 70 councils. When councils ask comparable questions, we publish the high and average scores to enable participating councils to recognise and learn from the industry leaders. In this report, the average and high scores are calculated from **WA Councils** that have completed MARKYT® accredited studies within the past three years.





### Overall Performance | industry comparisons

The 'Overall Performance Index Score' is a combined measure of the Shire of Esperance as a 'place to live' and as a 'governing organisation'. The Shire of Esperance's overall performance index score is 70 out of 100, 4 index points above the industry average for WA and an improvement of 12 index points over the past two years.








Window 2 includes lower performing areas that are improving. Celebrate progress and continue to work on areas such as:










