Walk Trails and Beaches

Dempster Head

Rotary Walk & Summit, as well as Lovers Cove Trail, are dog friendly (on leash). These are lovely nature trails providing amazing views and one of the prettiest beaches around.

Great Ocean Drive/Walk Trail

The beaches between West Beach & Eleven Mile beach are all dog-friendly except for Twilight Beach. The 25km Great Ocean Walk footpath welcomes dogs on leash.



Town Foreshore/Castletown Quays/ Baarndi Trail

Start from anywhere on the Esplanade in town and walk towards Castletown Quays and the start of the Baarndi Trail to Bandy Creek. You can even walk all the way to Lucky Bay Brewing!

Orleans Bay/ Wharton Beach

Located 85km east of Esperance (sealed roads all the way via Condingup), on the other side of Cape le Grand. If you have to miss the national park because of your dog, Wharton Beach is just as beautiful as Lucky Bay! White sand, turquoise water, and dog friendly.

Dog Exercise areas:

Sports Grounds - Black St/Jane St/Brazier St.

Wildcherry Park - Wildcherry Avenue

In public places, dogs must always be on a leash and under effective control by their owner. This means you must be able to hold the dog without it pulling away from you, prevent it from rushing at people or other animals, and the dog must obey simple commands.

The Shire of Esperance has dog-friendly areas where your dog can enjoy a run around without the restrictions of a lead. Please remember your responsibility to control your pet. If you choose to exercise your dog off a leash in the approved areas, you must have effective control of your dog, meaning you must be close by and carry the leash to use if required.
