## **Jetty Architects meet with Council**

H+H Architects were awarded the tender for the Esperance Tanker Jetty Replacement Detailed Design Development in March this year. Director Julie De Jong met with Council on Tuesday afternoon and the Jetty Replacement Working Group that evening to undertake stakeholder consultation. There was also an opportunity provided to representatives of the Friends of the Tanker Jetty to present to Council and Ms De Jong.

The purpose of these meetings was to have an open dialogue on the objectives of the project and the design approach H+H Architects would be taking. The presentations involved discussions on key issues and risks, heritage aspects and how the project will progress with the ultimate aim being a fully approved Detailed Design endorsed by the Esperance Council, Heritage Council of WA and supported by the community. From here H+H Architects will begin the draft concept design.

The prescribed outcomes for the Detailed Design are:

- The provision of a detailed design that is approved by the Shire of Esperance Council; the Heritage Council of WA (HCWA) and the Jetty Replacement Working Group
- The provision of a detailed design that is considered shovel ready – a design that can be used to source funding from State and Federal governments
- The provision of a detailed design that can be released for tender allowing for accurate construction costs.

Once a Draft Concept Design is ready it will be made available to the community for comment. This feedback will be received and used to update the final concept design. Prior to commencing the development of a draft concept design, H+H Architects have reviewed all previous engagement data and condition assessment reports.

Shire President Victoria Brown said “It was a great discussion with Julie, her heritage knowledge and experience has reinforced Council’s confidence in her as the Project Leader on this significant community project. Hearing the way the social and heritage values can be captured in the Jetty story will provide us with a jetty that will encourage future generations to make their own memories.”

Ms De Jong said “Design is always a compromise. A new jetty can reinterpret the heritage values of the old while satisfying the needs of generations to come.”

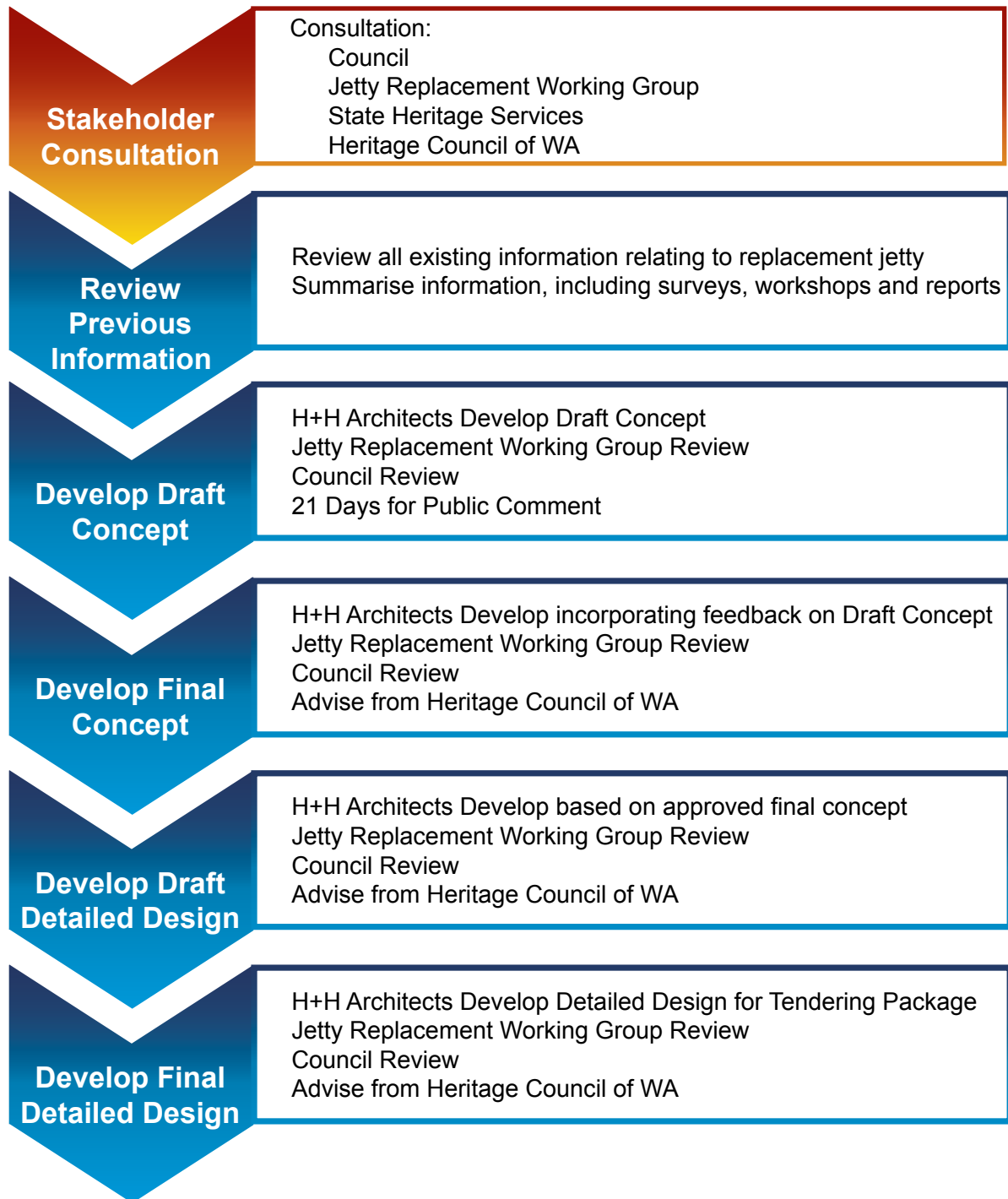
