## Free Waste Weekend

Following the success of previous years free domestic waste disposal weekend at the Wylie Bay Waste Facility, the Shire will hold another free weekend in June.

The free entry weekend is an opportunity for people to dispose of larger items, such as furniture, white goods and electronic waste, without having to pay an entry fee into the waste facility.

It has been scheduled following the June long weekend to give everyone the chance to clear out and sort through items and prepare.

The free waste disposal weekend will be held on Saturday June 11 and Sunday June 12 from 8.30am to 3pm.

The free entry covers standard domestic trailer and ute loads only, garden rubbish ie; lawn clippings, tree prunings, general household rubbish, general junk - bicycles, clothes, toys, baskets, plastic products, timber, steel pipes, metal, motor vehicles (car or motor bikes), batteries, empty stoves, fridges, freezers, washing machines, old furniture: lounges, chairs, beds, cupboards, bricks, tiles, builders rubble, sand, cement, concrete products, electrical appliances, computer equipment and TVs (maximum 2 per individual load)

Charges will apply to loads greater than 2 cubic metres, such as trucks, oversized trailers or commercial waste, tyres, oil, gas bottles and mattresses, all non-conforming loads will be charged at applicable gate, fee rates, paint, chemicals,

fuel and hazardous materials such as Super 6 fencing and asbestos will not be accepted. Other items at gate attendant's discretion.

Avoid delays: Items will be separated on site into recoverable items, recyclable need to be organised. Items to be separated include general recyclables, e-waste, green waste, mattresses, batteries, steel, white goods, rubble building waste, and salvageable items.

For people suffering hardship or those unable to transport their items on the free weekend, please call the Shire for referral to agencies that may be able to assist.

## Munglinup Campground Upgrades

One of the things Esperance is famous for is our beautiful coast and the amenities allowing campers to enjoy it. Council is committed to the upkeep of these areas to keep our tourism industry thriving.

Munglinup Beach campground is a pristine coastal nature based campsite site used primarily for recreation. It is a sheltered location, highly valued by the local community and is used as a traditional spot for summer swimming lessons. The campsite is popular with locals and visitors and is managed between the Munglinup Caravan Park and the Shire of Esperance. The agreement covers collection of fees, emptying of bins, cleaning of toilets and a camp host role.

Thanks to funding from Tourism WA, this beautiful campsite is set to see some upgrades to the amenities including fencing, signage, waste collection, beach access, installation of a new toilet facility and day use shelter.

In order to complete the upgrades, minimise inconvenience to campers and ensure visitor safety, the campground will be temporarily closed after the June long weekend, Tuesday 7 June through to Friday 1 July.
