Writing an effective submission for Council

Have you ever wondered how to have your say on an issue before Council? Commenting on Social Media may be a good way to let off steam but there is no guarantee it will be read by your elected Councillors. By writing an effective submission however, Council will not only be informed of your concerns, but will address them and take on board your suggestions.

With three local laws currently under review, now is the time to put those submission writing skills into practice and have your voice heard. Here are some tips for writing effective submissions:

1. Know your audience - while obviously you want your submission to ultimately be read by members of Council, be mindful that it will often be summarised in order to be placed in a database. Writing your own summary will make sure your submission will be accurately interpreted. Don't forget to provide figures to support your submission.
2. Do some homework - most importantly, read all the documents Council have provided so you know what research has already been done. Council publications are easily accessible on the Shire website or you can request them at the Shire Administration Office.
3. Structure is all important - use a report structure or table where possible, not a narrative. Introduce yourself and state your interest and who you represent. Use dot points and highlight key recommendations.
4. Scope and style - stick to the topic and avoid including comments about other issues. Identify the good and the bad about the proposal and be factual, providing examples or references.
5. Ask for Feedback - Ask for acknowledgement or receipt and request feedback on how your submission was analysed or how the information you provided was useful.

Above all, show Council that you have logically analysed the issue without emotion and remember that your submission will be publicly available under Freedom of Information legislation and may be published in the minutes and agendas.
