Norfolk Pines

Work was completed this week to treat Norfolk Island Pine trees infected with a fungal disease. Previous testing confirmed the presence of a pathogen called Neofusicoccum parvum after some trees had been showing signs of decline from the tops downward. Samples were sent to a laboratory for analysis and recommendations from consultation with the laboratory and a qualified Arborist were to remove the infected part of the tree and apply nutrients to the soil. The removal of the infected area will promote recovery on the trees.

Eight trees were pruned back to take away the infected areas, and five trees needed to be removed entirely as the infection had progressed the whole way down the tree. Two trees identified as potentially needing treatment were found to not be infected by the disease.

The trees will be continually monitored to check the disease has been eradicated and has not spread to other trees. Our annual replanting program is underway and we will look at replacing some of the iconic Norfolk Island Pines that were lost over the next few months.
