Parking Signage

Have you seen the new parking signage in the town centre? A two hour parking limit applies unless otherwise signed. The 15 minute parking zone outside the post office will remain the same, and the '2P' will not apply to taxi zones, loading zones, disabled bays and off street parking. This reduces the number of signs on the main street. New parking signage and time limits were identified through the Esperance Town Centre Parking, Traffic and Pedestrian Strategy to help improve parking options in the town centre.
